Do you hear birds sing? Do butterflies, bees and blooms catch your eye? Want to fill your garden with wonder and help native wildlife?

Then the Gardens for Wildlife program may interest you.

Gardens for Wildlife is a free program open to all households, schools and businesses in Hume City that are interested in attracting and supporting native wildlife in their gardens.







Gardens for Wildlife inspires people to create gardens using plants that attract native birds, insects, butterflies, lizards and much more. These spaces become places where wildlife can visit, shelter and make their homes.

From a few pots to a little patch of plants or the whole yard, every bit of wildlife habitat adds to important connections across the landscape.

Chat about nature

You can arrange a free garden visit with a friendly pair of volunteer Garden Guides who'll come to your place.

The Garden Guides will listen to what you like about your garden, and discuss what plants and wildlife you'd like to have in your garden.

Most importantly, you'll receive tips and advice on ways to create a wildlife-friendly garden in your space.

There is a wildlife-friendly garden recipe... choose your ingredients:

0	plant in layers (trees, shrubs, grasses, wildflowers and groundcovers)
0	a mature tree, native to your area
0	keep tree hollows or install nest boxes
0	dense shrubs where birds can shelter
0	nectar plants for honeyeaters
0	native daisies for butterflies
0	a frog-friendly pond
0	natural mulch layer for bugs and worms
0	a warm, sheltered spot for lizards
