Sunbury Pop Festival: A look back at Australian music's coming of age

In a quiet slice of rural Hume City, nestled between Sunbury and Diggers Rest, lies an important piece of Australian music history. You can't tell by looking at it now, but 50 years ago over 35,000 live music fans from all over descended on Duncan's Farm to attend The Sunbury Pop Festival that ran from 1972 to 1975.

Prior to 1972, Australians had hosted two Woodstock-style festivals, but what would take place on this unassuming patch of land would eclipse them both and take the music scene by storm.

Gil Mathews, drummer for "Billy Thorpe and the Aztecs - the biggest Australian band at the time of the Sunbury Pop (also known as Sunbury Rock) festivalrightfully attributes the title of "Australia's Woodstock" to the four-year music revolution.

"We headlined, being one of the biggest bands of the time, and playing to 35,000 people. None of the other festivals had that amount so it was where you wanted to be."

Sunbury Pop Festival quickly fell into the category of "you have to be there", a sentiment shared by artists like Gil, and members of the public.

Former Gladstone Park resident Jock Delalande recalls missing the first festival in 1972, but not making that mistake twice.





"After the first festival in '72, word got around that it was where to go to see all the big Australian bands, and it was massive! And that's all that matters...put good bands on, people will come."

Both Gil and Jock remember it as a time that Australian music was coming of age, and the festival came along at the perfect time to bottle the new sound; out with the hippie, in with the pub rock!

"Right at that time," recalls Gil, "Australian bands started playing loud, writing their own songs, telling music companies what they wanted. To an extent [Sunbury Pop Festival] brought this new style of music to people en masse."


He adds that it was ahead of its time in more ways than one.

"It was the first time a PA had been together like that, blaring at 1000 watts the Aztecs set was recorded and earned us gold records!" The new sound of Australian music was coming alive in Hume, and as both men agree, Sunbury Pop Festival was all about good times, and neither has ever met a person that's had a bad word to say about their time there.

Of course, that's not to speak of legends Queen being harassed by the crowd in 1974 (the international, and at the time unknown, act got on stage late. Uncool man!).

That aside, the legacy for Sunbury remains untarnished. It was about good music and good vibes. Top bands wanted to be there, locals had to get a ticket and it put our pocket of the world firmly in the history books.

For the 50 years since Sunbury Festival's origins, music festivals have remained a rite of passage for some, and a music mecca for others in search of tunes and good times... leaving the door open for Sunbury '24 to make its mark one the modern scene.

Sunbury '24: celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Sunbury Pop Festival



Sunbury '24 festival is a new music and arts program celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Sunbury Pop Festival.

Known as Australia's version of Woodstock, the original festival hosted renown artists including Billy Thorpe and the Aztecs, Queen, Deep Purple, Renee Geyer and many more. It paved the way for many live music events in Australia including Big Day Out and Splendor in the Grass demonstrating its cultural legacy.

Boasting a program in celebration of the Sunbury Pop Festivals from the early 70s, Sunbury '24 will feature artists who performed there 50 years ago, as well as contemporary Australian artists. "I feel very connected to Sunbury '24, having worked with many of the artists who played the original Sunbury Festivals. This year we are honoured to have a number of these legends perform together with awesome contemporary artists. The significance of this 50-year anniversary is undeniable, a legacy that marks a pivotal moment in Australian music history."

Temmuz ayından itibaren tüm hanelerde bir gıda ve bahçe çöp kutusu bulunacak. Evinizde parlak yeşil kapaklı çöp kutusu yoksa Nisan ve Haziran ayları arasında bir tane teslim edilecektir. Yeni çöp kutunuz boşaltılmaya 1 Temmuz'dan itibaren başlanacaktır, bu nedenle kullanmaya başlamak için bu tarihi bekleyin.

Gıda atıkları çöp sahasına gittiğinde iklim değişikliğine sebep olan sera gazları oluşturur. Ortalama olarak, Hume sakinlerinin çöp kutularına attıklarının (ağırlık olarak) %40'ından fazlası gıda atığıdır.

Her eve bir yeşil çöp kutusu sağlayarak gıda ve bahçe atıklarınızı besin maddelerini toprağa geri kazandıran komposta dönüştürebiliriz.

The great green bin roll-out

From July, every household in Hume will have a food and garden bin.



Did you know... that keeping food waste out of landfill can have a big impact on climate change? When organic material breaks down in landfill it creates methane, one of the most damaging greenhouse gases.

By weight, over 40% of what goes in the average household garbage bin in Hume is food. What a waste! Instead, we can turn food scraps and garden

clippings into compost, which can be fed back into the soil.

That's why, between April and June, we will begin delivering food and garden bins (the green bin) to households that don't have one yet.

Once your new bin arrives, you will need to keep it safe until collections start from 1 July.

This bin will be used to recycle your food scraps and garden clippings, rather than sending them to landfill.

If your house already has a green bin, don't worry – nothing

is changing. You can keep putting your green bin out every fortnight as usual. Garbage bins will continue to be collected weekly.



Fast facts

- From July, every home in Hume will have a food and garden (green) bin
- If you don't have a green bin we will deliver one to you between April and June
- We will start collecting the new green bins from 1 July
- Green bins will be collected every two weeks, on the alternate week to recycling bins
- If you already have a green bin, it will still be collected as usual
- Your garbage bin will still be collected weekly


