New laws make Hume a better place for everyone

We've introduced a new set of local laws to improve Hume City and keep our community safe. What's new and how does it affect you?

We've made changes to our open-air burning regulations, allowing it in the context of cultural or religious practices.

We're cracking down on people who destroy or deface Council-owned property, which is there to be enjoyed by all members of our community.

Stronger penalties will apply to people who neglect their property and leave it messy, which impacts on others' right to a clean neighbourhood.

Considering the financial hardships faced by locals, we're allowing some use of camping on Council owned land, where appropriate, based on compassionate grounds.





Council services can help with your holiday clean-up

Along with eating leftovers and watching the Boxing Day test match, the annual clean-out is almost a classic holiday tradition too. Here are our tips for clearing unwanted items from your home safely and responsibly.



Christmas tree mulching

Pine trees smell like Christmas, but what do you do with it once Santa has been and gone? Take it to one of our free mulching days!






Old tools, broken furniture and sports gear from last century can be taken to our Resource Recovery Centres. Every Hume household gets two visits per year - including renters.

Too big for the bin?



Some things are too big for the car boot – like that broken fridge from the 80s sitting in your garage. Thankfully, you can book a hard waste collection and we'll pick it up for you. All households in Hume can book two collections per year.

Broken electronics?



Using these services is easy, and is also better for the environment. Plus it helps to keep landfill to a minimum.







A sense of community

A Hume resident shares why local spaces mean so much.

Our new Mickleham South Community Centre opened in September and is already popular with locals, providing a space to learn and meet.

We recently met with Shaelle Scriberras, local resident and business owner who operates her dance school Bella Star Studios at multiple community facilities in Hume City.

A true Craigieburn local, Shaelle's journey in the world of dance began at the age of four. Her interest in dance led to a change in career and a new opportunity to bring her passion to a new audience.

"The biggest benefit is that it gets kids and parents involved in community and they have a sense of community." she says.

"If these community centres weren't being built, they (the

next generation) would not have the opportunities I've had."

Shaelle operates her business at the new Mickleham South Community Centre, as well as other local centres in Mickleham North and Greenvale West.

She is a strong advocate for local community centres as they provide opportunties for people of all ages, and because they enable both parents and children to get involved and experience the true spirit of community.

"The facilities are great, there's lots of different rooms you can use - it's a great centre for different activities," she says.

"A lot of the kids mentioned to me before this they were doing nothing and they had wanted to dance their whole lives. So to them this is a big change." Find a community centre near you and get involved.

التنظيف خلال العطلة الصيفية

السلامة في الصيف

إن الصيف في هيوم عظيم، ولكن من المهم الحفاظ على السلامة

- المراقبة قرب الماء راقبوا الأطفال دائمًا قرب الأحواض المائية، تعلَّموا السباحة ومهارات الإنقاذ من الغرق، وتفادوا شرب الكحول قبل النزول إلى الماء، وارتدوا سترة النجاة عند الإبحار في زوارق أو صيد السمك أو التجديف.
- اقهروا الحر تفادوا الأمراض المرتبطة بارتفاع حرارة الجو وضربات الشمس عن طريق البقاء في الأماكن الباردة وشرب الماء. توفر مكتباتنا العامة ومراكزنا المجتمعية بيئة باردة ومريحة خلال الأيام الحارّة.
 - السلامة من الحرائق انتبهوا إلى تحظيرات وتحذيرات إشعال النار، وحصّنوا منزلكم ضدّ الحريق وجهزوا خطة للتصرّف في حال نشب حريق في المنزل أو في المناطق المحيطة به.
 - الأمان من الأفاعي خلال فصل الصيف قد تقصد الأفاعي أماكن دافئة خلال الأشهر الحارّة، بما في ذلك الحدائق العامة وعلى ضفاف السواقي والأنهار، وأحيانًا في الحدائق الخلفية للمنازل حيث يكون العشب طويلًا أو هناك شجيرات كثيفة. فعند المشي في الخارج ارتدوا بنطالًا طويلًا وحذاء مُغلقًا وابقوا على المسار المخصص للمشاة.

Topluluğumuzun güvenliğini sağlamak için yerel kanunlarda değişiklikler yaptık. Bu değişikliklerin arasında, mülklerini ihmal eden ve dağınık bırakanlar için getirilen daha ciddi cezalar da var. Ayrıca, Belediyenin sahibi olduğu ve topluluğun yararlanması için oluşturulan, oyun parkları gibi mülklere zarar veren veva buraları tahrif eden kişilere karşı da ciddi duruşumuzu koruyoruz.

Tatil temizliği

Kiracıların da aralarında olduğu her Hume hanesinin, Sunbury ve Campbellfield'deki Atık Kurtarma Merkezlerine her yıl iki ücretsiz ziyaret hakkı bulunmaktadır. Bu merkezlere "tip" de denir. Dilerseniz evinizden atık toplanması icin rezervasyon vaptırabilirsiniz. Bu durumda atıkları sizin için alırız. Atıkların toplanması için her hanenin, yılda iki kez rezervasyon yaptırma hakkı vardır. Yaz güvenliği

Hume kentinde yaz dönemi harika geçer, ancak güvende olmamız da önemlidir. Bu nedenle:

- Suda güvenlik: Cocukları her daim gözlevin. yüzme ve can kurtarma becerileri edinin, su/ deniz/havuz yakınında alkol almaktan kaçının ve tekneyle açılırken, balığa çıkarken ve kano kullanırken can yeleği giyin.
- Sıcak havadan korunun: Serin bir yere gidip su içerek sıcaklığın yol açabileceği hastalıklardan ve sıcak çarpmasından korunun. Kütüphanelerimiz ve topluluk merkezlerimiz sıcak günlerde tercih edilebilecek rahat ve serin yerlerdir.
- Yangın güvenliği: Ateş yakma kısıtlamalarına ve uyarılarına uyun, mülkünüzü hazırlayın ve şimdiden bir plan yapın.
- Yaz döneminde yılan tehlikesi: Sıcak aylarda yılanlar park, nehir kenarı ve kimi zaman uzun otları ya da sık çalıları olan evlerin bahçelerinde ısınmak icin sıcak verler aravabilir. Dısarıda yürürken uzun pantolon ve kapalı ayakkabı giyin ve patika/yollardan ayrılmayın.



Be safe this summer

Summer in Hume City is great, but it's also a time when we need to be mindful of our safety, and the safety of others.

Here are a few tips to stay safe this summer.



Watch around water

Going for a swim is a great way to cool off, but please ensure you and your family stay safe around water. Council and Life Saving Victoria urge everyone to:


- · always supervise children around water
- learn swimming and lifesaving skills
- · wear a lifejacket when boating, fishing or paddling
- avoid alcohol around water.



Beat the heat

Extreme heat affects everyone, especially babies and children, people with a medical condition, and older people. The best way to prevent heat-related illness and life-threatening heatstroke is to stay somewhere cool and drink plenty of water.

Council's libraries and community centres offer comfortable and cool spaces you can visit on warm days.



Summer snake safety

Snakes become active in spring through to autumn, and will often seek warm places to sunbake, particularly along waterways, in parks and reserves, and sometimes in backyards with dense shrubs, tree hollows and long grass. When walking outdoors where snakes may be, wear long pants, covered shoes and stay on paths.

If you see a snake in a public area or your property:

- stay calm
- do not approach or attempt to catch or kill the snake
- · when safe to do so, calmly move away from the snake, and keep watch if possible
- keep children, pets and others away from the area containing the snake.

While snake bites are rare, they do pose a serious health risk if the species is venomous. If you have been bitten by a snake, call 000 immediately for emergency assistance.



Fire safety

Fires are a real risk in Australia. Make sure you know what you can and can't do during the Fire Danger Period, and pay attention to fire restrictions and warnings, prepare your property and be sure to have a plan in place.

If you own property in Hume City, you are responsible for ensuring it's free from fire hazards. You need to mow the grass, clear fallen branches, or remove flammable materials. Council inspects properties in the lead up to summer, and may issue fines to properties that are noncompliant.



Blue-green algae

As the weather starts to warm up, blue-green algae blooms can develop in our nearby lakes and reserves. They are naturally occurring, not usually dangerous and will go away in time however large amounts of blue-green algae can cause skin irritation or illnesses for people and pets. Do not come into contact with the water, or let pets enter or drink it.

A Colourful Hume

Over the past few years, our city has become more colourful with eye-catching public art across Hume City.

A more colourful Hume

To make it even faster to find your bin day in the future, I recommend saving it to your phone's home screen. On the website you can also discover more information about your local Councillors, and learn about Council services near your home.
