The Mayor advised that the Council meeting was being livestreamed on Council's website and that an audio recording of the Council meeting would be made and published to Council's website within 2 working days of the meeting.

The Mayor advised that as Council is the owner of the copyright in the livestream and notwithstanding anything appearing on Council's website, any recording, copying or other use of the livestream is strictly prohibited and would therefore constitute a breach of Council's copyright.

2. PRAYER

The Mayor read the following:

"Hume City's religious diversity strengthens and enriches community life and supports the well-being of the citizens of Hume City. Hume City Council acknowledges the importance of spiritual life and the leadership offered by the Hume City Inter Faith Leaders Network. In recognition of the religious diversity of residents in Hume City, Council has invited the Inter Faith Leaders Network to take responsibility for the opening prayer at Council meetings. This evening's prayer has been provided in advance of the meeting, and is led by Mr Chandra Bamunusinghe on behalf of the Buddhist Temple Daham Niketanaya."

11. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

PQ750 MS KATHERINE LAWFORD

Has Hume City Council to date received further information back from the Applicant of Application No. P22489 since they last supplied information in December 2019?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT)

No further information has been received from the permit applicant since December 2019.

PQ751 MS KATHERINE LAWFORD

Can Hume City Council advise if the Applicant has failed to meet any Council deadline or failed to supply any requested document in relation to Application No. P22489 for a waste to energy incinerator proposed for 65 Amaroo Road, Craigieburn?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT)

Council had anticipated receiving additional information from the permit applicant in early May 2020 which is yet to be provided. The applicant has advised that work preparing the additional information has been delayed by restrictions related to the recent COVID-19 pandemic. At this stage, Council has not been provided a timeline for when this information will be received.

PQ752 MR ROBERT WILLIAMS

I would like to ask when the last traffic count was done on Amaroo Road, Craigieburn and what the counts were?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE AND SERVICES)

The last traffic count done on Amaroo Road was from 15 to 29 June 2018. The average two way traffic count was 611 vehicles per day, with an 85th percentile speed of 83.2 km/h.

PQ753 MR ROBERT WILLIAMS

In recent history the storage of chemicals, recyclables and waste both legally and illegally in Hume municipality has resulted in fires and other environmental disasters and has had huge impacts on the health and wellbeing of our community and environment.

I am concerned that with Hi-Quality Group tendering to receive prescribed waste containing PFAS and asbestos among other contaminants at their Bulla site from the Tunnel project, the planning application for one of the largest waste incinerators (P22489) in Australia, as well as numerous ongoing legal and illegal chemical and waste storage sites that Hume has will continue to develop a reputation as the place to dump rubbish.

What policies and practices does Hume City Council have in place to stop this happening?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT)

Council cannot prevent private operators of landfill facilities participating in public tender processes or making planning applications for landfills or other waste treatment facilities.

Council, in conjunction with the EPA, does seek to ensure that existing facilities are operating in compliance with the relevant regulations and requirements. The illegal dumping of waste is a national issue and is not confined to Hume.

Council has consistently advocated to the Victorian State Government to do more to prevent the illegal dumping of waste.

PQ754 MRS ANN WILLIAMS

On 9 December 2019 the following motion was moved by Councillor Jackson: That Council Officers investigate and report to Council on the possibility of a dedicated site for the Northern Community Recycling Group to undertake their outstanding community contribution to our community, and that any report considers that the group currently operates in Craigieburn, has had significant community participation, and is in need of a shed to continue their work and expand as the group's activities evolve. This motion was carried by the Council. As yet the Northern Community Recycling Group have not been contacted by Council Officer to enquire as to any accommodation requirements.

What is the status of the Council report?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE AND SERVICES)

The Northern Recycling Group provided vital support to both Council and the community during the SKM recycling shutdown period in 2019. Since November 2019, kerbside recycling services have returned to normal operation with the re-opening of the Coolaroo Material Recovery facility which is now owned and operated by Cleanaway Pty Ltd.

A number of attempts were made during December 2019 and January 2020 to contact the Northern Recycling Group to further understand their requirements for a shed however, Council officers were unable to obtain contact.

As kerbside recycling has resumed normal service combined with additional self-haul and kerbside services via Council's Resource Recovery Centres and hard waste collection, an update was provided to Councillors in May 2020 as part of the Strategy and Policy Briefing regarding the status of the motion moved by Councillor Jackson.

Council officers would be happy to discuss the needs of the Northern Recycling Group if accommodation support is still required.

PQ755 MS SHERIDEN TATE

Through conversations with community members it appears the live streaming of council meetings has been well received, this is also reflected by the number logged into the meetings (55 for the May 11 meeting). I consider this demonstrates an appetite by the community for live streaming of council meetings, as it enables a platform for engagement by interested community members who may not be able to attend meetings in person. In light of this will council take steps to amend the Code of Meeting Procedures to allow for live streaming of council meeting to become a permanent fixture.?

RESPONSE: (DIRECTOR CORPORATE SERVICES)

The Victorian Parliament passed the Omnibus Act 2020 that allowed Councils to conduct online meetings and required online meetings to be live streamed on the Council website, that expires on 1 November 2020.

Under the Local Government Act 2020, Council is required to create 'Governance Rules' before 1 September 2020 which will replace the current Code of Meeting Procedures. Given the limited time for consultation with the tight timeframe set by the State Government for making the Governance Rules, it is planned to incorporate the current Code of Meeting Procedures into the Governance Rules.

Following the Council election in October 2020, Council will review the operation of the Governance Rules including the option of live streaming Council meetings.

- Approves bringing forward funding from the 2020/21 2.5 financial year to 2019/20 to allow for the expedited delivery of these grants in June 2020.
- 2.6 Approves for those local sports clubs/associations that have an existing debt to Council, that some or all of their grant amount will be applied to that debt.
