# HUME CITY COUNCIL VOLCANO DREAMING

## Volcano Dreaming is an epic mural showcasing the amazing diversity of life found in the wildflower grasslands of Victoria's western plains.

This detailed montage of over 3,000 photos is the creation of <u>Inherit Earth</u>. It depicts an intriguing grassy landscape, revealing the flora and fauna in a stunningly detailed panorama.

The mural comprises twelve x 1m-wide fabric banners; it is easy to install and dismantle. Each banner has a theme, describing various aspects of our native grasslands, what has happened to them, or how they are being preserved.

Your school, community group or organisation can borrow this beautiful exhibition from Hume City Council for free.

The Victorian Volcanic Plains (VVP) bioregion has fascinating geological features and rich Aboriginal and European histories. This mural shows many special native plants and animals of the basalt plains.

These grassland communities have been devastated since European settlement, with widespread land-use changes and by numerous other threats. Less than 4.5% of the original extent (2.3 million hectares) now remains. Some experts say no more than 0.01% of good quality grasslands survive. These unique Victorian ecological communities are listed as being critically endangered under both federal and state environmental legislation.

Important places, such as the Evans Street Grassland in Sunbury, help to conserve and protect what little is left. Many other remnant grassland and grassy woodland patches are dotted across Hume City in nature reserves.

Extensive notes about native grasslands and research links are available online at volcanodreaming.com.au.

Schools can access teacher notes and student worksheets from Ecolinc in their program called <u>Footprints</u>. The AusVELS curriculum-related materials for Years 4 to 7 complement each panel. Ecolinc provide free apps (Apple devices only) of field guides of grassland flora and fauna, specifically of the <u>VVP</u> and also more broadly for <u>south-eastern Australia</u>.

Hume City can provide further educational support for local schools through biodiversity-related incursions and excursions. The popular <u>Seedlings for Schools</u> program offers free indigenous grassland seedlings.

Some rural landholders in Hume City may be eligible to apply for a frant or rebate through the <u>Rural Engagement Program</u> to undertake on-grounds works to enhance their native grassland remnants on their property.

For full impact, the Volcano Dreaming mural is best displayed in a straight line or semi circle. Or it can be curved around corners. For one person, it takes around 20-30 minutes to set-up or pack-down the twelve panels.
