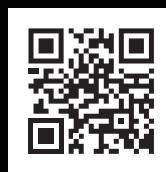

SCHOLARSHIP CATEGORIES AND ELIGIBILITY

The Teachers' Scholarships 2012 is open to any teacher and/or educator currently practising in Hume City and who fits one of the six scholarship categories below.

EARLY YEARS EDUCATOR

Open to preschool teachers, childcare workers and early years practitioners.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

PRIMARY SCHOOL TEACHER

Open to anyone teaching a minimum of two and a half days a week in a government, non-government or specialist primary school.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHER

Open to anyone teaching a minimum of two and a half days a week in a government, non-government or specialist secondary school.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

OPEN CATEGORY

Open to registered or qualified trainers, tutors, TAFE teachers, lecturers, coaches or educators. This includes people teaching at neighbourhood houses, TAFEs, universities, sporting clubs, home-based businesses, corporate training, employment support or special interest organisations.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

GRADUATE TEACHER

Open to anyone teaching a minimum of two and a half days a week in a government, non-government or specialist primary or secondary school. Entrants must have been teaching for no more than three full years.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

OUTSTANDING TEAM

Open to any groups comprising of two or more members teaching at least two and half days per week combined at any of the learning organisations listed in the previous categories.

Winner: \$4,000

Runners-up: \$500

The Teachers' Scholarships allow teachers to learn about new models, ideas and approaches to supporting lifelong learning, knowledge or skill development in Australia or overseas. This may include attending conferences and workshops, or working on an innovative project.

3. Submit your nomination to Hume City Council (see back page).

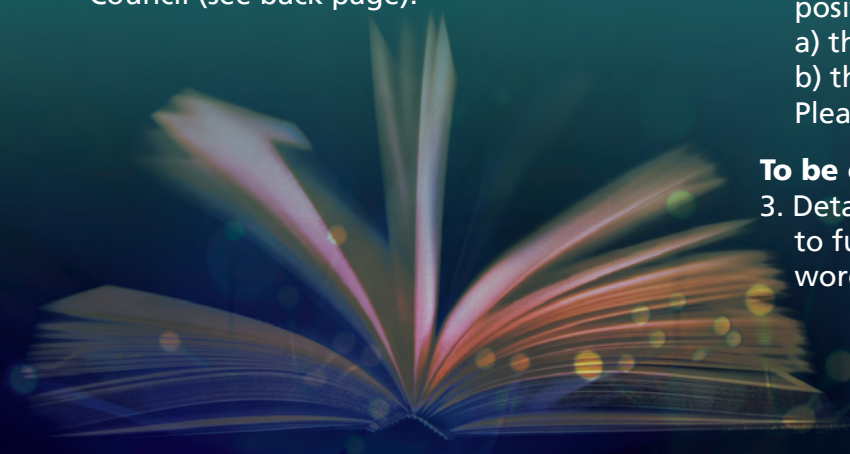

KEY DATES 2012

- Nominations close on Sunday 30 September.
- Nominees will be shortlisted in October.
- Shortlisted and unsuccessful nominees will be notified in late October. Winners will be announced at the Teachers' Scholarships awards evening in November 2012.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The closing date for all entries is Sunday 30 September 2012. No submissions will be accepted after this date.
- Nominee and referee consent must be given prior to a nomination being submitted to Hume City Council. If consent has not been given by either party, the nomination cannot be accepted. To verify consent, the nominee, referee and nominator must sign this form and return it with the final submission.
- The scholarship must be used and a financial acquittal statement provided within a year of receiving prize money.
- The selection panel reserves the right to allocate a nominee to an alternative scholarship category.
- Nominations will be assessed by a selection panel according to the criteria. The selection panel's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Hume City Council will retain personal information for the purposes of administration and promotion of the Teachers' Scholarships program.
- All shortlisted nominees are required to attend the Teachers' Scholarships awards event in November 2012. The winners in each category will be announced at this event.
- Hume City Council reserves the right to use all or part of any material submitted with this nomination (photographs, film footage, application submissions or any detail) for the purpose of promoting the Teachers' Scholarships program via print, broadcast and/or online media and publications, or for other forms of publicity, promotions or related campaigns.
- Finalists and winners of the Teachers' Scholarships may be required to participate in media interviews.
- Winning teachers must be willing to be interviewed for Hume City Council publications and/or media and undertake public speaking engagements with the aim of furthering lifelong learning in Hume, and promoting Hume City Council and the Teachers' Scholarships.
