Your rates at work:

Sunbury

- opening of the new Hume Global Learning Centre – Sunbury
- continued construction of the John McMahon Recreation Reserve
- upgrades to the Sunbury Aquatic and Leisure Centre.

Bulla

- construction of a modular pavilion at Bulla Village Tennis Club
- resealing of the section of Bulla-Diggers Rest Road from Loemans Road to the Sunbury Road roundabout
- commence reconstruction of sections of Wildwood Road South, to be completed over two years.

Tullamarine

- redevelopment plans for Derby Street Reserve

How are rates calculated?

Council calculates how much income from rates is needed to provide services as well as build, maintain and upgrade the City's assets over the next year. This income is divided by the total combined value of all properties in Hume to get the 'rate in the dollar' – for 2019/20 this is \$0.0033056.

The rate in the dollar is then multiplied by the market value of each property to ensure each ratepayer contributes a fair share. Council uses the Capital Improved Value (CIV) of property to calculate rates – this method values the land and all improvements on the land.

A rate cap of 2.5 per cent for the 2019/20 financial year applies to all Victorian councils under the Victorian Government's Fair Go rates system. Hume City Council is compliant with this cap.

Making the most of your waste and recycling services

You're entitled to up to two free hard rubbish collections and tip visits each year.

You can take advantage of:

- two collections of up to three cubic metres of hard rubbish
- OR**
- one collection of up to three cubic metres of hard rubbish and two visits to a local tip with a regular load of hard rubbish (i.e. a load that can be transported in a single-axle trailer, car boot, ute or van)
- OR**
- one collection of up to three cubic metres of hard rubbish and one visit to a local tip with a large load of hard rubbish (i.e. a double-axle trailer load).
