HUME CITY COUNCIL HEAVY MOTOR VEHICLE PERMIT CONDITIONS

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A permit is required for an owner or occupier of land to keep a motor vehicle that weighs more than 4.5 tonnes.

(Council General Local Law No. 1 2013 Part 3 – AMENITY, clause 3.4 Heavy Vehicles)

Heavy Motor Vehicle Conditions:

- Application must be fully completed before your application can be processed, including all requested information and duly signed and dated.
- If applicant is not the property owner, written consent from the property owner must be obtained before the application can be processed.
- Where a person applies for a permit under clause 3.4.1, Council will notify and consider the views of the owners or occupiers of land adjoining that person's land, and any other owners or occupiers of land whom Council or an authorised officer considers appropriate prior to making a decision to grant a permit.
- The property crossover used by the heavy motor vehicle must be constructed to Industrial Crossing Standards (refer
 to attached plan for specifications). You will be required to obtain Consent to Work within a Road Reserve Permit
 and then Asset Protection Permit prior to conducting works to construct an industrial crossing when preliminary
 permission has been granted.
- Applications will be referred to all relevant Council departments for consideration.
- The motor vehicle is not to overhang the property boundary or obstruct any part of the footpath or nature strip.
- Use of exhaust brakes in a residential area is prohibited.
- Heavy and long vehicles are not permitted to park on the street for longer than 1 hour.
- The applicant will be liable for any damage caused to Council's assets.
- Any motor vehicle over 50 tonne mass (at general mass limits) or 45.5 (at higher mass limits) also requires a permit
 to travel on Council's local road network.
- Environmental Protection Authority's guidelines referring to residential noise are to be adhered to. The engine is not to be left running idle for any period of time before 7:00am and after 8:00pm Monday to Friday and not before 9:00am and after 8:00pm on Weekends or Public Holidays.
- Environmental Protection Authority's guidelines referring to Motor Vehicle Emissions must be adhered to.
- Council reserves the right to revoke this permit at any time if in the opinion of an Authorised Officer, any condition of the permit is being breached

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GUIDELINES & INFORMATION FOR HEAVY MOTOR VEHICLE PERMITS:

Who can apply?

Anyone seeking or wanting to keep a motor vehicle weighing more than 4.5 tonnes on private land within 50 metres of any dwelling on adjoining land.

Please note:

Applicants must apply prior to the keeping of a motor vehicle that weighs more than 4.5 tonnes within 50 metres of any dwelling on adjoining land.

When can I apply?

Applicants may apply once they have obtained all the required information and documentation required with this application in order for it to be processed.

What does Council take into consideration when assessing an application?

Any requirements of Council's Traffic & Civil Design Department, Technical Services Department, Health Department and Statutory Planning Department.

Environmental Protection Authority's guidelines with regards to residential noise and emissions.

The purpose of the motor vehicle being kept at the specified address.

The placement of the vehicle on the property.

The views of adjoining property owners or occupiers.

The views/requirements of VicRoads.

How do I apply?

You must complete the application and provide all relevant documentation in order for your application to be processed. You can lodge your application using the following options:
