SmartBus is a premium bus service that complements Melbourne's radial train network, providing 'cross town' connections to train stations, tram lines, key local destinations and other activity centres. SmartBus runs more frequently and for longer hours than most bus services

Melbourne's outer suburbs 1.30am-4.30am on Saturdays and 1.30am-5.30am on Sundays with additional services on some routes.

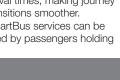
