Melbourne's outer suburbs every half hour between 1.30am-4.30am on Saturdays and 1.30am-5.30am on Sundays with additional services on some routes.

There are more than 460 NightRider stops along routes to Bayswater, Belgrave, Craigieburn, Cranbourne, Croydon, Dandenong, Doncaster, Eltham, Epping, Frankston, Healesville, Lilydale, Melton, Mornington Rosebud, St Albans, Sunbury

You can request to get off anywhere along the NightRider route, not just designated stops, provided it's safe for the bus to stip. Simply let the driver know where you'd like to hop off so that you can get closer to your destination.
