Expression Of Interest Hume Jobs and Skills- Lived Experience Working Group

Hume City Council established Hume Jobs and Skills Lived Experience Working Group to provide broad group of stakeholders an opportunity to share their experience and to identify barriers to equitable access to employment.

We encourage applications from individuals who are from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community, Culturally and Linguistically diverse backgrounds (CALD), young people, women, mature aged (55+), persons with a disability and people living in the postcodes of 3047, 3048, 3061 and 3064.

Purpose of the Working Group is:

- To bring together a broad group of stakeholders to share insights and stories with a view to preventing barriers to access meaningful employment
- To provide input and help develop interventions to improve services that meets the needs of job seekers and
- Be part of shared decision making on issues that impact their community

Role of the Working Group is:

- To play an advocacy role and be champions for their community
- Act as an Ambassador between the Jobs and Skills Taskforce and the community

Membership

Membership of the working group will be up to 10 community members on a twelve-month membership.

Meeting Times

The Jobs and Skills- Lived Experience Working Group will meet initially meet fortnightly for two months and then once a month. The members will be supported by Hume City Council Staff.

As a Working Group member, you will:

- Connect with like-minded members of the Hume community
- Establish new relationships and improve your network
- Develop new skills and be supported by council staff throughout the duration of your role

Essential Criteria

Hume City Council is seeking applications from individuals who meet the following criteria:

- Currently unemployed and actively seeking employment
- Reside in the postcodes of 3047, 3048, 3061 and 3064

Assessment

All applications will be assessed according to the above essential criteria. Applications will be assessed by Officers from the Local Employment Partnership Team.
