Part 2


Ask a friendly librarian to help you register your passport. You can also do this yourself at hume.vic.gov.au/HXP

Rocky towers


Stack stones to make a tower.

Muddy masterchef

Mix some dirt and water to make a mud cake.

Alternative - mud soup recipe

- Mix one cup of water with one cup of dirt (use a bucket or find a puddle)
- 2. Stir until it becomes sticky
- 3. Add six sticks

4. Sprinkle grass on top

5. Add three small rocks

Remember: mud cooking is only for playing - not for eating!

All-natural shaker

Materials:

 One empty and sturdy plastic bottle with a lid

 Natural materials (rocks, sticks, seeds, leaves...)

Instructions:

Tip: get an adult to help you

Fill the bottle with nature items

Screw lid onto bottle and secure the lid with sticky tape

3. Shake the bottle and make some music!
