## VACCA Cultural Hub

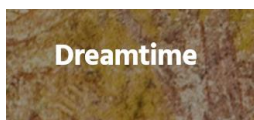
The Cultural Hub is a space that celebrates Aboriginal culture and is full of deadly activities and resources for children to help you get creative, grow your knowledge and connect to culture.



## Koorie Heritage Trust

The Trust offer a range of programs and services including

- The only public collection in Victoria dedicated solely to Koorie art and culture comprising artefacts, pictures and photographs
- Oral History Program
- Reference Library
- A cultural education service that includes guided walking tours, cultural competency training for workplaces and programs developed specifically for schools and educators
- Annual exhibition program with an emphasis on showcasing young and emerging Victorian Aboriginal art and artists
- Koorie Family History Service
- Retail shop showcasing Victorian Aboriginal art and design. We Meeting rooms for hire with views of the Yarra River and Federation Square



## Dreamtime stories

This portal allows any person, from any race, religion, gender, and generation, to step into the world of the Aboriginal Dreamtime. These stories have existed for thousands of years and guided many on their understanding of the world. Read stories including The Rainbow Serpent, Tiddalick the Frog, Umbarra (Black Duck), Eaglehawk and Crow, How the water got to the plains and more.



## Deadly Questions

## Deadly Story

This resource aims to support Aboriginal children and young people to grow in their knowledge of identity, community heritage, beliefs and what symbolises their Aboriginal culture. Activities for children, young people and practitioners about culture and identity, tools, templates, policy, service directory and Cultural Support Planning Practice.



### Deadly Tots

The Deadly Tots project develops resources that promote key messages and share the latest information on children's social, emotional and intellectual development with families and communities of Indigenous children. The resources developed by the Deadly Tots project include: The Love, Yarn, Sing, Read, Play flip chart; A Height Chart; The Love, Yarn, Sing, Read, Play song; Facebook page; and the Deadly Tots Website.



### Victorian Aboriginal Education Association Incorporated (VAEAI)

VAEAI aims to promote awareness of Koorie cultures and educational aspirations to the wider community. VAEAI is the principal partner to the Victorian Department of Education and Training, participating in the co-design and supporting the implementation of Marrung Aboriginal Education Plan.



### Walking Together

This resource provides an introductory overview of Koorie people, communities, customs and protocols. It is the culmination of insights from professionals working in Aboriginal education and includes resources and suggestions for practice.



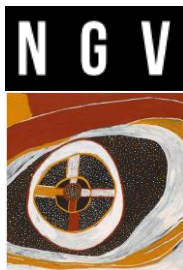
### Aboriginal Victoria
