#### 7. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

#### PQ1042 PUBLIC QUESTION – CHRIS O'NEILL

On the 22nd of May, Hume city council advised that the indoor pool at SALC would be closed for 2 weeks and the repairs would cost \$45,000.

On the 31st of May an update advised the indoor pool at SALC would be closed until late August, Early September.

On the 11th of August, Hume provided an update that the indoor pool would be completed mid to late October.

As we are now at the end of October, can Hume provide an update as to when the pool will be completed, open and ready for use and a total cost to ratepayers that has been budgeted for repairs.?

#### RESPONSE: DIRECTOR SERVICES & LIVING

In the course of undertaking repairs to the 25m pool, additional remedial works were identified and undertaken in the steam room, and the concrete pillars in the pool hall. Based on these unexpected additional repairs we now estimate that the 25m pool will reopen the week commencing Monday 20 November.

The cost of the repair and associated works for the 25m pool are projected to be \$525,550. Council continues to work with our insurance provider regarding opportunities to recoup some of this cost.

In addition to the repairs that were required to the pool shell, we have taken the opportunity to complete both additional as well as scheduled improvement works to the 25m pool area. This has included the concourse flooring (scheduled for 23/24), as well as new tiles and grating at the pool edge, new lane ropes, upgrades to the pool filtration, and safety improvement works in the sauna and steam room. These additional works have been undertaken at a projected additional cost of \$622,044.

#### PQ1043 PUBLIC QUESTION – CHRIS O'NEILL

Hume Council has been vocal on the damage of gambling across the Hume City Council areas with some reports putting losses to poker machines at \$390,000 per day in Hume or \$190 million per year (21/22 year)

Can council please provide a breakdown of all expenditure it has made to sporting clubs across Hume that operate poker machines over the past 5 years. Please provide a breakdown per ward, venue and club?

#### **RESPONSE: DIRECTOR SERVICES & LIVING**

Whilst there have been historical agreements with Clubs operating in Hume City, Council does not provide expenditure to Clubs who operate poker machines.

As per Hume City Council's Gambling Harm Minimisation Policy (2019), Council will not offer any financial support, in-kind support, or grants to owners and/or operators of EGMs, excluding Council's obligations as landlord (clause 5.3.8).
