Support for bridge and request for inclusion in Council's next budget. Due to the high risk of injury/death to pedestrians crossing this bridge on a daily basis firstly by a moving vehicle, I would seek to have this proposed bridge included in the next budget. My children and other local students have to cross this bridge daily to go to school. Many local people use the daily walks and go to Gadsden Park. Around school time, traffic is constant. Vehicles are legally allowed to travel at 70 km/h directly next to pedestrians walking across the bridge. There is no other close option. I don't have any of my children were walking in a school zone, this would be 40 km/h with a narrow strip between them and the moving vehicles. I do not recall any other place in my memory where I have seen pedestrians forced to walk directly next to traffic. According to <https://www.police.vic.gov.au/road-safety-0> the probability of a pedestrian being killed in a collision involving a vehicle increases rapidly if the speed impacts above 40 km/h. On several occasions [REDACTED] who is a teacher at Wesmeadows Primary School, has expressed her concern and how stressed she gets watching my children and other students crossing this bridge. I am asking, accordingly begging, for this to be done as soon as possible as I am terrified of the possibility of my children ending up as cases in a Coroners Court.

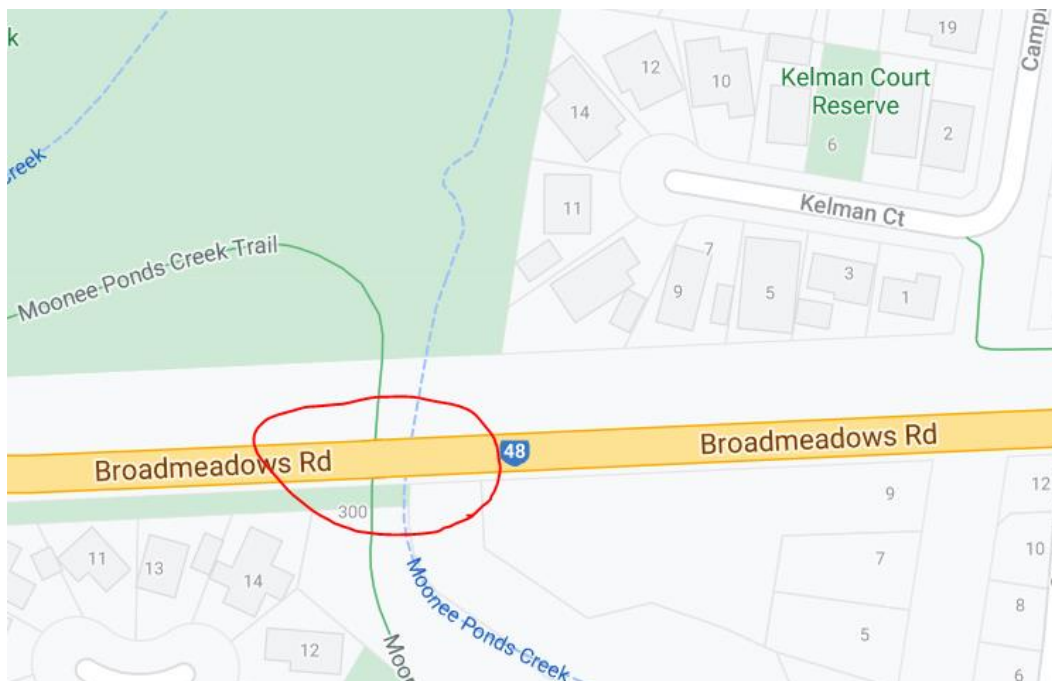

Dear Mayor and Councillors,

My name is Lorraine James and I have been a resident of Hume since January 1998. My family and I live at [REDACTED] I am mother to four children, the youngest three of whom are on the Autism Spectrum and also have ADHD. My three children on the spectrum can all have issues with road safety, mainly in times of stress or if they are overwhelmed. Usually they know to stick to the footpaths so they stay safe. I have two children at [REDACTED] Primary School and two at [REDACTED] Secondary College (my children are zoned to these schools). My children at Primary School need my direct supervision to get to and from school safely which means I cannot be there to assist my older two children.

The issue of my concern is the bridge over Broadmeadows Road located and circled in red as follows:



My secondary school children have to walk over this bridge twice every day to get to and from school, they are both cautious and apprehensive when crossing and stick as close to the outer edge as possible. They prefer to walk to school than be driven as it gives them independence, they walk part of the way with their friends plus they are getting some exercise. My autistic son, now in Year 7, is proud that he is able to walk to school and given the responsibility to do so. The other options for my children to get to the secondary school take 20-30 minutes longer and are out of their way and one involves crossing the extremely busy Johnstone St/Broadmeadows Road intersection (there are no traffic lights there so this too can be dangerous). Getting my autistic children ready for school on time is a challenge in itself without needing to add an extra 20-30 minutes to allow for additional travel time. Both sides of the bridge are the same in terms of how they are structured so each side is equally unsafe to walk on. I have seen many other local people also use this bridge to walk across and note that I also use this bridge when I walk my children to the Scout hall or when I exercise my dogs each day/evening.

Here is a photo of my oldest child crossing the bridge (this was taken in 2018, the road seems to be even busier now and after school it is almost constant):



I am desperate for changes to be made, I am asking council to consider building a pedestrian bridge along this section of road so there is a safe way for residents to traverse the creek without having to walk on the main road.

I first asked this of council in 2004 or 2005 but was advised that this was not in the plans. Unfortunately, I cannot locate any of this correspondence. I've spoken to people at council over the years with the same outcome. Attached are some more recent emails for your reference. Can you please consider this safety issue in your next Budget discussion as this is an extremely risky place to have to walk twice a day. During school times, this road is at its peak and there is not a break in the traffic where you can safely cross without vehicles sharing the same space as pedestrians. I also note that there is a merge point coming down the hill towards the bridge and I've seen impatient drivers using the gravel section next to the asphalt to cut in front of a driver which is right before the bridge. A further note that If there are two large vehicles crossing both sides at the same time, there is even less "safe" room. Lastly, there is a speed camera in regular attendance as a lot of drivers speed on this road, some of the speeds I've personally witnessed have been shocking (the speed limit is 70km/h which drivers are legally allowed to drive at directly next to my children – yet in a school zone there are 40 km/h limits in place to ensure the safety of the school children and they are walking at a distance of at least 1-2 metres away on the footpath)!

I am planning on setting up a petition to be distributed locally to try to make this bridge crossing safe for the people in our community but hope in the meantime that this matter can be discussed in relevant planning meetings. I have been in discussion with Councillor Naim Kurt regarding this issue also.

**Book: Coburg Mosque – The First 50 years:
*The mosque that shaped a community.***

Dear Mayor and Councillors
And Chief Executive Officer

We seek Hume City Council's financial support in regard to a local community initiative of a Book about the story of Victoria's first Turkish community established mosque, Coburg Mosque. Hence, we seek your support in telling the settlement story of the Turkish community of Melbourne, especially as the largest Turkish community lives in Hume.

Coburg Mosque has reached an important milestone of 50 years, since its founding in 1971, which went onto playing a significant role in the history and the lives of Victoria's Turkish-Muslim communities, as its where it all began. We aim to capture some of the wonderful stories of life around the Mosque over the 50 years, that can otherwise be eventually lost forever; to learn from yesterday so it helps us create a better future.

The Turkish community in the main started its migrant journey in the industrial suburbs of Brunswick and Coburg in the late 1960s and early 1970s. By the 1980's, the majority of its members moved into Broadmeadows and have made Hume their permanent home since. This is their story.

The project will cover a historical overview of the era of the 1970's Australia and beyond, reflections of founding members settling into a new society, the invaluable contributions made by volunteers, of individual memories, hidden stories, personal perspectives and insights of the challenges and hardships that came with being a nascent community in trying to establish their first community centre. All complemented by historic photographs and documents.

The vast majority of Coburg's descendants now live in Hume, making it the largest Turkish and Muslim population in any local government area in Victoria. This project fits well within Hume's Multicultural Framework and supports Hume celebrating its diversity and harmony. Today, Hume is home to many culturally diverse communities, the city one of the most diverse local government areas (LGAs) in Victoria and Australia.

We envisage this project will encourage members of the local Hume Turkish community to feel proud of their heritage, of a history they can connect to, and a legacy they can pass onto the future generations.

Furthermore, the project aims to raise to the awareness of and educate the wider Australian community of the history and heritage of the Turkish-Victorian communities, showcasing its achievements and positive contributions over many generations. We plan to appeal to as wider an audience as possible, as both the Book and Digital Storytelling Platform will be in English. Our primary goal is to be able to make a valuable contribution for the preservation of the diverse history of multicultural Victoria, for all to benefit.



We would be most honoured to have Hume City Council part of this project and support its local Turkish community. Hume's support will be formally recognised in both the publication and the digital multimedia platform.

Project Outcomes

By publishing the histories of the Turkish communities' settlement in Victoria by way of establishing its first mosque (community centre), we hope to be able to;

- 1) Foster stronger communities and a sense of community.
- 2) Further enrich multiculturalism and social cohesion.
- 3) Instill an active interest and appreciation of local history, our pioneers and its unsung heroes, amongst the younger generations.
- 4) Preservation and education of Turkish-Australian history and culture
- 5) Better understandings of the Turkish community's migration, settlement, citizenship and the evolution of the Australian-Turkish-Muslim Identity; and
- 6) Create a digital platform for the current and future generations to continue to tell their stories.

1. The provision of a proper, safe and effective access way to the 2nd storey courts (Courts 3 & 4) from within the Basketball Stadium. Presently, the only access from within the building is across Courts 1 or 2 which is both disruptive and unsafe when activities on those courts are in progress. Ensures the safety of patrons and participants during activities.
2. The provision of adequate and sufficient toilet facilities to service the general public. The existing facilities are insufficient in number and do not meet the current requirements for handicapped access. Ensures the venue meets minimum modern standards.
3. An upgrade to the current change rooms. There are outdated toilet facilities connected to the change rooms that need to be upgraded. These facilities given the current access are unavailable for public use when the change rooms are in use. There is an opportunity here to address the concerns raised in items 1 & 2.
4. Provision of a medical room/ rehabilitation space. Recent injury requiring ambulance attendance has highlighted the need for a properly equipped and sufficient space to effectively deal with such incidents and ensure adequate privacy.

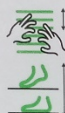

I would be glad to see new/updated playgrounds being built within the Gadsdon Park/Wesmeadows area. While there are quite a few small playgrounds around the area, many of them are small, with limited equipment and outdated. None of them cater to children with mobility issues, and are quite often without reciprocal access to the play space. When you see the playgrounds being provided in the new estates around Craigburn, Sunbury, Donnybrook, there is a stark difference between what is available, and how they are maintained. A so-called cycle/scooter park for children here means they don't have to ride around or across roads and makes fun for them, and keeps them active. The raffic park at As on Craigburn is a great example of a small space being made available for them. I rave to other councils (Moreland, Brimbank, Moonee Valley) to access these things because they are better provided by these councils. I see the same with adventurous and nature-based playgrounds. While it's great to see playgrounds around the Wesmeadows/GP area being updated, they are generally just replaced with the same old swing, slide, monkey bars. It's very boring and an outdated approach to play equipment. It has become very obvious that money isn't spent on these existing communities, but rather where developers want to be spent to make their estate communities more attractive to buyers.

Greenvale Tennis Club are scheduled for a lighting upgrade as per the Outdoor Sports Lighting Policy, 2023/2024. However with the ongoing problems that our volunteers are facing in regard to lighting, we are requesting this upgrade be brought forward.

Q2. Please provide the details of your submission (required)

Greenvale Tennis Club continues to operate with the Ume Municipality as one of the oldest tennis clubs in the area, having been established in 1913 with only 2 courts. Since then it has grown and is currently thriving with the support of Ume City Council and the referral packages that were provided during the pandemic. With 9 courts operating at our facility, it is very popular with the local community, competition and even spectators. However the constant maintenance of our grounds is creating ongoing problems for organisers and disruptions to our night competition and we are seeking to submit to Council the scheduled lighting upgrade for Greenvale Tennis Club be reconsidered in the budget. According to the Outdoor Sports Lighting Policy our upgrade has been categorised as the final stage in the 2023/24 financial year. Our committee and members of the club are concerned that the infrastructure is not adequate for social play and to continue participating in the night competition, given recent readings reported by the North Suburban Night Tennis Association (NSNTA) Chairman of the Match and Permit Committee. While we are marginally meeting the overall standard, here are 5 out of 9 courts that are performing less than 50% below the 200 lux requirement at various points on court. We have also received complaints from some members regarding the visibility of play on courts even with the current lights, and during competition have had to run two court lights even though only one court was being used. From a light usage and electricity cost perspective this practice cannot be maintained long term. We have had to sacrifice many issues with lights going out on courts making it impossible to play or coach. Also we do not receive any revenue from a court that must be closed due to having a light out and the maintenance is fixed. The ongoing effects of this are endless with coaching having to be shuffled around and the online system having to be updated to reflect a closed court, as operated by volunteers who give up their time to support the club and these ongoing issues. At the most recent NSNTA delegates meeting was reported that 5 clubs in the competition (none of which were Ume clubs) were not meeting standard lux requirements and at risk of being banned. With our club only just meeting standard, we wish to address the issue of our lights urgently before we become the first club in Ume to be addressed by the NSNTA to be given a timeframe for improvements or otherwise be banned. We do not believe that our lights will perform satisfactorily over the next two years without ongoing problems for our volunteers, committee and are therefore requesting an intervention that the funds for our lighting upgrade be brought forward.

The Association tested the lights at your Club's courts on 28 January 2021. The detailed readings for each court are attached to inform your Club, together with a comparison of the readings from when the lights were last tested.

All courts meet the 200 lux average minimum requirement. However, the reports reveal a significant number of areas on all courts below 200 lux which we encourage your Club to look into. In particular:

- Court 2 - 9 out of 15 points are below 200 lux
- Court 6 - 9 out of 15 points are below 200 lux
- Court 7 - 8 out of 15 points are below 200 lux
- Court 8 - 9 out of 15 points are below 200 lux
- Court 9 - 8 out of 15 points are below 200 lux

Given courts 6 and 8 are only just above the average minimum requirement, we will test your club's lights again in approximately 12 months time.

Generally ok with Ume's proposed FY22 Draft Council Budget, however the following items seriously need to be addressed going forward to protect our Ume suburbs, neighbourhood characters and surrounding built environments. 1. Before approving/endorsing any major subdivisions, namely, forward planning and agreement to upgrade surrounding infrastructure (i.e. roads, public transport, trunk infrastructure) needs to be undertaken concurrently with subdivisions. Prime examples are the many recent housing estates near Mckelham Road & Somerton Roads - thousands of new residents, however 5+ years after developments, the roads remain a single lane and no footpaths! 2. 'Council Improvement' works/upgrades need to respect and maintain the existing level of quality/amenities and neighbourhood character (at minimum) over long-term budget alternatives. (example: the 2020 Traffic signage works on Fawcner Street, Wesmeadows - the local community expressed outrage at the permanent removal of blue kerbs, which have been in place for centuries being replaced with standard concrete kerb and channels. Existing asphalt was replaced/reinstated in patches with concrete and exposed aggregate footpaths patched repaired with convenient concrete randomly). Amenities look really poor and does not respect one of the only heritage areas of Ume. Under and new standards/DDA compliance may need to be considered however other regions (i.e. Moonee Ponds/Essendon/Warrambool etc.) have successfully negotiated/maintained their blue kerbs in recent upgrades (refer photos attached). 3. Would be great to see Ume invest in sustainable infrastructure (i.e. solar farms or wind farms or power Council owned assets). And Plan more reserves; more recreation along residential streets, creeks and parklands, especially in existing established suburbs. 4. There doesn't appear to be too much funding allocated to the Awood/Wesmeadows suburbs. 4.1 What we appreciate the \$455K allocated to upgrade the Fawcner Street shopping precinct, realistically this budget won't provide much of an upgrade. Could this be increased/reviewed to a higher allocated considering the surface footpaths need to be regraded/upgraded in addition to street furniture, reserves, lighting, etc? **blue kerbs to be reinstated/renewed 4.2 Wombrook Reserve Upgrade - appears to keep getting deferred every year? could this be fast-tracked to be completed this year instead of just the masterplan design? 4.3 Would be great to see missing footpaths reinstated along the following parklands: a. Wesmeadows Reserve: missing footpaths to oval & playground/kinder area b. Awood/Anbrae Lake (Anbrae Terrace/Chadwick Lane/Stonebridge Way) footpath loop around Lake c. Parkers Court (built missing footpath from Baerman Street playground reserve loop). Other comments: Somerton Road & Secombe Road intersection \$3.2M (page 55): Costs should be shared government/vic roads not council funds?

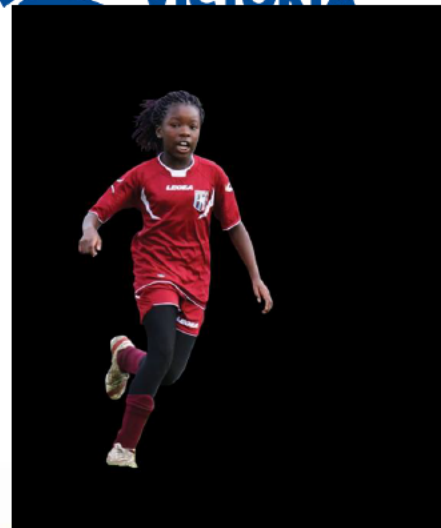

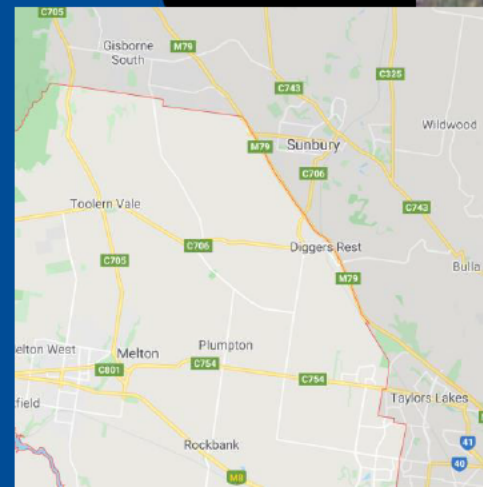

I wish to comment on behalf of the Bo erhouse Thea re Company, which I'm sure you're aware is the only community theatre company in Hume. We have been without a performance space of our own since 2017, when Council shut down our theatre with no notice. For the remainder of 2017, we used Building 13 on the VC Un campus, which was not an ideal space, but a space nonetheless. At the beginning of 2018 VC Un would no longer allow us access, so we moved to the only other theatre in Sunbury, at K ara Primary School. Again, this was not ideal, but we were assured that Hume was trying to help us find another space. Just before COVID, the Bo erhouse committee decided we could no longer afford to hire the theatre at K ara, as the school decided they were going to raise the hire fees to \$4,000. As a non-profit community group, there is absolutely no way we can afford that. Post-COVID, we are now struggling to set up our next season as there is no guaranteed performance space in Sunbury. With the old theatre out of action, even for rehearsals and workshops we are struggling to find space in the Bo erhouse Community Arts Centre as several different groups are currently using it, and we need to maintain the recommended amount of people per space. The Arts - and particularly the Performing Arts - have been ignored by Hume for so long, and when we contacted Hume back in 2017 asking for help, absolutely nothing was done to begin to resolve the issue. I would be incredulously disappointed if the new Arts precinct, and in particular a new theatre, wasn't acted on as a matter of priority.

Greenvale Tennis Club is one of the oldest tennis clubs in the Lume Municipal, having been established in 1913, and home to Australia's greatest tennis champion, Chris Guccione. Chris's currently head coach and his family have long been involved in both coaching and more recently holding positions on the committee. The current committee is a dedicated group of volunteers who are motivated in continuing the legacy of Greenvale Tennis Club and transforming it into a modern and dynamic sporting facility that meets the needs of our growing and diverse population. Last year Greenvale Tennis Club commenced discussions with Tennis Victoria and with the help of our Club Development Officer have established the Greenvale Tennis Club Action Plan. We have already taken steps to develop on key areas of the Plan such as building our relationship with Council, improving our digital presence, establishing good governance practices, and providing a safe and inclusive environment for our sport. According to the Lume City Council Outdoor Sport Plan participation trends in tennis indicate an increase in both children and adults over a 3-5 year period. With our own membership rate increase of 65% in less than two years, here is a strong indication that our current population growth will continue to see a rise in the game of tennis. However with the development of the Greenvale Recreation Reserve, the Greenvale Tennis Club finds itself being overlooked for funding to improve its sporting pavilion to match the other sporting clubs shares its space with, including the Greenvale Equestrian Centre and the Greenvale Football Club. In May 2020 we were asked to endorse the addition of the Greenvale Indoor Cricket Facility, and whilst we did indicate our support for the new cricket hub, was not without comment on our frustration for the amenities and funding allocations we have been given for our clubhouse. Previous budget allocations were for a \$165,000 upgrade to the entry of the pavilion, which later changed to an approximate \$650,000 pavilion upgrade. Our committee and members have been waiting patiently following the release of the Greenvale Recreation Reserve Master Plan, and have written many emails to Council regarding problems with the clubhouse, the main one being that the accessibility for people with a disability are allocated down some steps to a lower level. There is also the water damage to the front foyer and main clubhouse area due to drainage issues that have never been resolved. Therefore following heavy rain volunteers must retrieve the tennis court soakers and commence soaking up the extensive water effects in the main area. The clubhouse has no electric or gas heating and cooling. There is no office or first aid area, forcing volunteers to use their own homes as areas to operate clubhouse administration. Clubhouse hire is complicated with four different doors that need to be locked with 2 different keys and a keycard. The clubhouse is dated and requires updating. The new carpark is scheduled to commence in August, though we've been informed there will be no parking, so with children walking through the carpark during winter months and a high competition and social events, the difficulty with visibility will continue to prove a major problem for our tennis community. From an overall perspective the whole facility is perhaps one of very few, if not the only tennis facility with a perimeter fence. This makes difficult completion of the Book A Court hardware reduced by most tennis clubs because we have multiple entry points and an approximate \$15,000 per entry point would be a very costly exercise at our Club. Also with the clubhouse situated right at the top of the facility, the courts at the far end always require maintenance due to trespass and vandalism as they are difficult to monitor from the main road and clubhouse. Courts have been added to the facility over the years without much thought to design, which has resulted in a disjuncted atmosphere. It is the intention of the club to submit a request to Council for allocation of funding to build a brand new modern, modular tennis pavilion with ramp access for wheelchair tennis players and/or spectators, accessibility, easy access to the venue, heating and cooling facilities, bar/kitchen, office and social/common areas. Our club is working collaboratively with Council in providing site reports, preliminary drawings, etc to determine the scope of the works, as we believe the relocation of a brand new pavilion positioned between the upper courts (1&2) and middle courts (4,5&6) would provide a more connected tennis facility with future prospects for perimeter fencing, but more importantly a visual connectedness for our whole tennis community to each and every court within the facility. We welcome any discussion with Council on this topic and urge Council to consider our request based on the improvements and brand new structures being added to the Greenvale Recreation Reserve with the exception of our only and historic tennis club. Thank you for your time.

What:

In collaboration with Hume City Council Economic Development, NORTH Link is seeking funding to support the delivery of a Women in Business Leadership program. The trial will lead to a standing annual leadership program for women living and working across Melbourne's North.

The program acknowledges the importance of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). SDG Goal 5, Gender Equality, seeks to empower women and girls and ensure their equal rights. Furthermore, it states gender equality is not only a fundamental human right but a necessary foundation for a peaceful, prosperous and sustainable world.

In addition, the program builds on Hume City Council's Social Justice Charter (2014) and the wide range of activities and networking events already in place to support women in business leadership. An excellent example of this is the annual Women in Front event which brings together 200 women to network in a supportive environment.

The program will support 10 mid-to-senior female leaders to further their leadership skills, build confidence, learn new strategies and gain a wider network of supportive peers. The program will combine a mixture of intensive workshops, regional networking events and mentoring.

The program will enable participants to:

- deepen their self-awareness and understanding of personal leadership style;
- overcome self-limiting beliefs, behaviours and build personal resilience;
- identify strengths in others and motivate teams to raise performance;
- skilfully negotiate and influence others to achieve desired outcomes;
- speak persuasively on issues of importance in the workplace;
- build a supportive network of peers from various industries; and,
- adapt approaches to progress workplace challenges.

Ten scholarships will be made available to women living or working in the Hume municipality with local businesses having the opportunity to nominate colleagues to participate in the program. The scholarship will cover the cost of participating in the 12-month program. Activities include a 3-day intensive workshop, regular peer networking events and one to one mentoring. Whilst there is no direct cost to local businesses, they will be required to support participant's attendance through back-filling roles during intensive workshops, networking and mentoring events.

Why:

The need for a Women in Business Leadership program to further build the capacity of local women is evidenced by regional, national and international research. Within a growth area context, research commissioned by Whittlesea City Council states that *"women in*

Melbourne's northern growth area are more likely to experience underemployment compared with men and compared with women in inner-city and middle suburb areas". The table below demonstrates the gender gap across key areas including unpaid childcare, income and employment in managerial, professional or technical/trade occupations.

In 2020, the Workplace Gender Equality Agency (WGEA) and the Bankwest Curtin Economics Centre released research showing an increase in the share of female 'top-tier' managers by 10 percentage points. This led to an average 6.6 per cent increase in the market value of Australian ASX-listed companies.

In addition, research undertaken by US accelerator MassChallenge and the Boston Consulting Group (2019), outlined that every dollar invested in a female led start-up provided a return on investment of 78 cents. Whereas male-led companies averaged a return of 31 cents.

Simply put, women in business leadership positions are high-performers and drive improved business outcomes. However, the below data from WGEA demonstrates women remain under-represented at board, executive and senior management levels.

- Women hold 14.6% of chair positions and 28.1% of directorships and represent 18.3% of CEOs and 32.5% of key management personnel.
- 30.2% of boards and governing bodies have no female directors. By contrast, only 0.4% had no male directors.

Further, the issue of pay equity and related superannuation balances remain a key drag on achieving meaningful gender equity and improved business performance. The below statistics from the WGEA confirm this.

- The full-time average weekly earnings for women are 13.4% less than for men.
- Among non-public sector organisations with 100 or more employees, the gender pay gap for full-time annualised base salary is 15%, and 20.1% for full-time annualised total remuneration.
- The median undergraduate starting salaries for women are 2.5% less than for men. This gap widens 13.0% for postgraduate (coursework) graduates.
- Median superannuation balances for women at retirement (aged 60-64) are 21.6% lower than those for men.

Who:

The trial is a collaboration between Hume City Council's Economic Development team and NORTH Link. As the key regional economic development organisation in Melbourne's North, NORTH Link is well-positioned to lead the trial program. In future years, the partners will seek broader support from business and local governments across Melbourne's North, creating a growing and highly impactful regional approach to supporting women in business leadership.

Whilst seed funding is required for the trial, the partners believe the program can become self-sustaining through corporate sponsorship in future years. The partners are in discussion with Leadership Victoria to provide the expertise and program backbone. An evaluation of the 12-month trial will inform further growth towards a regional offering.

The proposed trial would run for 12 months across the 2022 financial year.

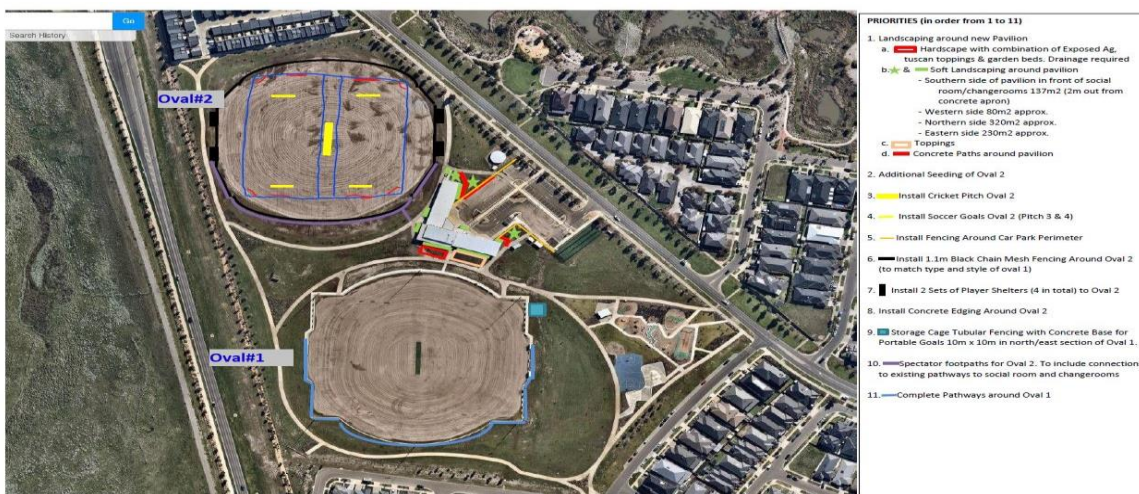

Pedestrian Causeway / Bridge over Avulsion Channel

This submission constitutes a request yet again for the Council to make financial provision for construction of the Project described below which has widespread local Community support.

1. Background: More than 22 years ago, after years of discussion and negotiation between the (than) Bulla and Hume Councils, local residents and professional Consultants, a Master Plan for the long term restoration of the Emu Bottom Wetlands Reserve ('the Reserve') was approved and adopted.
2. The Master Plan was particularly visionary and even made provision for the extension of public land to the south which is only now, some 26 years later, coming to fruition. In particular, it made provision for a "bridge" to be constructed over the "Billabong".
3. The rationale for this crossing was to facilitate better public use of the Reserve as it would permit safe access to major and scenic areas on a rational basis. The crossing would enable a safe circular walk around the Reserve irrespective of whether or not there was water in the Billabong.
4. The need for this crossing has been canvassed with Council Officers more formally since at least 2010 but, whilst there's agreement as to the desirability of the crossing, no realistic action has been taken. Various reasons were advanced – not in the Master Plan (it is); Sunbury out of Hume; not affordable (never assessed) etc.
5. FOEBWR has been established for nearly 28 years and has planted most the mature flora in the Reserve as well as having raised some \$200,000 to support that bush regeneration and other improvements – all **independently** of Council financing. The Friends, as selfless volunteers, had the vision and the energy to transform the Reserve area from its pastorally degraded state to the bushland beauty which is so widely admired today. It is only in very recent years that the Council has planted without the participation of the Friends. The Friends kept strictly to the Master Plan whilst the Council activities seem

to be less compliant. It is the view of the Friends that the landscape tapestry is largely complete as originally designed and future plantings may be confined to maintenance or replacement. The philosophy of the plan is to recreate the rural character of this significant and historic area with a tapestry which allows for pleasurable public use and preserves view lines of significant natural beauty.

6. In 2018 a tract of land to the south of the existing Reserve became available with the cooperation of Salesian College, the Developers and PP&WP CMA. The Friends lifted their activities to commence planting and restoring a bushland vista in that area.
7. The Friends were unable to attract any interest from Council engineering staff to spend any time looking at the site. Had they done so, the need for the crossing would be immediately apparent and some concept of the possible construction might have resulted, all of which might have lead to some reasoned idea of the cost and design. This is yet to be done.
8. There is not always water in the Billabong and it is often dry. The vision of the proposed crossing is one designed and restricted to pedestrian traffic and would thus be of a lighter construction. There is really no water flow as such and the water rises and falls with rain, flood or drought conditions. Water is disbursed to a small degree by outflow but largely by absorption or evaporation.
9. Presently the Public are led to follow a well defined Council constructed path into the Reserve and back along the same track. Many users have made their own (now well defined) track on the southern border which leads to the billabong and then clamber down the muddy side of the channel and up the other side. This is done even if there's some water present and is both dangerous in terms of Public Risk and leads to damage to the banks and the billabong environment. It does allow for a most scenic circuit of a beautiful part of the Reserve. This is the point where the crossing would be most suitable.
10. There is strong Community support for this project, the necessity of which has been well recognised over a period of years. FOEBWR has accumulated donations of \$3,356 so far towards paying part of the completed project. These funds are restricted for this purpose only.
11. Conceptually other areas of future expenditure should be given some thought in conjunction with the specifics of this

project. They include expanded car parking, improved drainage and some elementary shelter within the Reserve.

12. A previous similar Submission made in connection with the 2019/20 Budget was declined for being "too late".
13. **This submission seeks formal acceptance of the project accompanied by financial analysis and allocation in the upcoming budget year.**

I am writing to you as a committee member and parent of three young athletes who are members of the Sunbury Little Athletics Club.

The committee have long discussed this matter and we wish to make a submission to the Hume City Council's 2021-22 Draft Council Budget.

The submission is as follows:

To redevelop the Sunbury athletics track currently located at Boardman Reserve into a modern and accessible track and field facility capable of hosting local sporting events and Regional athletics competitions.

Background

The sport of Track and Field is synonymous with the Olympic movement and watched by billions of people across the world every four years. Competitors of all ethnicities and socio-economic backgrounds can compete on a level playing field as many events require little or no costly equipment. No other sport encompasses such a vast array of events, making it a truly inclusive environment for young athletes to find their niche.

The Sunbury Little Athletics Centre Inc. (the Club) has provided a pathway for a number of talented athletes to reach their potential since its first season in 1971-72. The club has a proud history of supporting athletes from diverse backgrounds and has a strong focus on supporting athletes with a disability, ensuring that all participants compete in an environment that focuses on skill development and personal bests rather than just winning.

Significantly, the upcoming 2021-22 season will also see us celebrate our 50 year anniversary.

Over the past few seasons, the club has seen an exodus of talented teenage athletes who have chosen to relocate to clubs with purpose built facilities including synthetic all weather tracks. Athletics clubs such as Essendon, Keilor and Melton have benefitted from Sunbury athletes joining their ranks to compete on synthetic tracks or train with coaches who are attracted by a higher standard of facility.

Community Benefits

The current grass track is not considered adequate for hosting local school athletic carnivals, resulting in Sunbury schools travelling long distances by bus to compete on synthetic tracks.

Whilst the club currently has a number of athletes with a disability, the grass track is not considered suitable for wheel chair athletes.

The redevelopment of the Track and Field facility at the Boardman Reserve will ensure that Sunbury caters for the ever expanding needs of the local community and takes its place amongst the elite sporting hubs in Victoria.

Our Proposal

The Sunbury Little Athletics Centre Incorporated proposes the following upgrades to Boardman Reserve:

- Resurfacing of the track and field facility to an approved synthetic all weather material
- Lighting towers for twilight meets and after hours training

“ We expect all of this work to cost somewhere in the order of \$3 million and would welcome any State or Council investment for this vital project.”

Sunbury is obviously one of the fastest growing communities in the North West and I believe that the redevelopment of the site into a fully functional all year round athletics venue with a synthetic track and upgraded facilities is essential for the area.

Sunbury Little Athletics Club has produced some amazing athletes in the past with club records held by the Sara and Mark Blicavs (basketball, athletics and AFL).

Over the past few years, the most promising athletes have been leaving the club and opting to join clubs like Keilor or Essendon due to the standard of their facilities. You just don't reach a high level running bends on grass tracks; it's as simple as that. A synthetic track will also provide a more inclusive environment for wheel chair athletes, an area we are keen to develop.

As a former Commonwealth Games bronze medallist myself, I know how hard it is to achieve results at the highest level and the journey for any elite athlete begins with strong grass roots participation, supported by an army of volunteers and parents who are truly responsible for helping the athlete reach their full potential.

Little Athletics provides a foundation for the development of fundamental motor skills used in all sports, and I couldn't be happier that my kids are enjoying it so much. I would like to see the club continue to expand its membership, and can't see this happening without the redevelopment of the current facilities.

Together we could turn Sunbury into a sporting hub of excellence and there is no better place to start than Little Athletics.

Submission to Hume City Council Re Draft 2021-22 Budget

The following Submission is made to have the second stage of the upper level of the Greenvale Social facility put back on the agenda for construction over the next few years. It appears that it has not been mentioned in the 4 year projections.

The upper level of the Social Facility was proposed in late 2012/2013 when the Greenvale Cricket Club (GCC) was considering the merger with the North Melbourne Cricket Club (NMCC).

The proposed construction was running parallel with the need for the construction of a change pavilion at the #2 Oval. The #2 Oval had been completed for the 2011 season and the Senior and Junior football and cricket teams were using a farm shed as change rooms.

By late 2016/early 2017 the plans for the Social Facility and the #2 Pavilion were being prepared and it was realized that both could not be built from the available funds. The offer of one or the other was discussed. T

The Club, the Councillors and Officers eventually decided to increase the overall expenditure a bit and to build:

- the #2 Pavilion -but without the 100sq.metre community room as initially designed and
- to build the current first stage of the Social facility-including a smallish social area, bar, media room, toilets lift and stairs but not including the main social room, ancillary rooms and the main upper level entry.

The idea was to build the next stage of the Social facility “in a couple of years” but with no time frame for the community room at the #2 Pavilion.

The whole concept of the upper level Social facility was that it would be extended. Its whole design was focussed on extension.

The #2 Pavilion was opened in October 2018. The Social Facility was finished in late 2018 but not handed over to the Clubs until April 2019 and not officially opened until June 2019

The Facility is occupied by the Greenvale Sports Club- the umbrella Club for the Greenvale Football Club and the Greenvale Kangaroos Cricket Club. The Greenvale Sports Club has approximately 2000 social members. The Football and Cricket Clubs are the largest in Hume. The Football Club has about 575 players spread over 22 teams. The Cricket Club has about 375 players spread over 28 teams. Both Clubs are still growing. The Football and Cricket Clubs could reasonably expect to grow their team numbers to the high twenties and low thirties respectively. This would make a combined total of nearly 60 teams.

The construction of the Upper level Social facility actually reduced the floor space of the lower level social area because of the need to accommodate the lift, the stairs and new entry. The usable area at ground level is about 120 sq metres. (The area is smaller upstairs) This makes it very difficult to provide meals for up to 90 people of a Thursday evening (Selection night). Many supporters simply stay away. We cannot even accommodate the after match crowd for most home football games for the speech's etc. We thought that these difficulties would only exist for a couple of years.

We recognise that we have the newest and most impressive Social Facility in the area, but we refer back to the thinking behind its design and construction. We desperately need the main Social Room

We also request that Council notes the sheer size of the Clubs whose members use the Facility and what more we could do for our Members and the Greenvale community.

The Greenvale Football and Cricket Clubs have been, and are still being, supported well by Council. We will not forget the support the Cricket Club received when we sought significant funding for the Indoor Cricket Training centre – funding which had not hitherto been set in the yearly Budget projections.

The Indoor Cricket training Centre funding has an effect. We understand that.

Dear Hume City Council,

I write to our Council in regards to the Council budget for [2021-2022](#).

I've lived in this council for the last 9 years and during this time I've worn many hats both personally, professionally and in many volunteering roles in Broadmeadows, Westmeadows, Attwood, Tullamarine, Glenroy, Dallas and surrounding suburbs.

Prior to going on maternity leave in 2016 to raise my 3 sons, I was in a respectable role at DHHS, Child Protection. I was respected by my colleagues, but more importantly - respected by my clients and their families.

I invest a lot of my time towards the Westmeadows/Attwood and Broadmeadows community by running the social media pages which has 12,000 active members which is continually growing, as well as running various community programs, workshops and initiatives which I created and run at various local locations. Everything I have created is to help better the lives and well-being of each individual who joins these FREE programs and improve our community! It's to bridge the gap between locals so they can form new healthy relationships with other locals from different cultural and religious backgrounds, opposite genders, different socio economic status, different walks of life, etc.

During 2020 - as administrator for the Westmeadows/Attwood group, I received an overwhelming amount of personal messages from our locals (and surrounding suburbs) asking for help, expressing their pain, fear, suicidal ideation, isolation troubles, financial stresses, family violence and domestic violence matters, health matters, etc etc. I felt fortunate to have an extensive background in community development and services, and being a qualified counsellor also helped me to assist, support, counsel and refer every single local onwards to receive the support or guidance they needed. More often than not, they needed someone to talk to! Whilst it was a lot to take on board as a volunteer as I was raising my own children - it was a privilege to have these locals trust me enough to reach out during one of their darkest times in life!

I've also supported and liaised with many of our Councillors in the Aitken and Jackson's Creek ward on community matters, concerns, projects and helped advocate on our communities behalf during election time. I've supported specific Councillors both personally and professionally when they were faced with unfair discrimination, bullying or harassment and even counselled them to ensure their well-being and mental health were not being negatively impacted during challenging times.

Due to my role in Child Protection, my name online is private and an alias so that my family will never be put at risk because of some of the threats I/we received in previous government roles.

In March 2019 - I applied for a community grant from Facebook Australia and Singapore. I submitted my proposal and programs for our community, went through every interview and meeting, went through every test and check against my name - and was extremely happy to be 1 of 20 people out of over 100,000 applicants who won a 10k grant to put towards improving our community! I've thoroughly enjoyed doing this and would love to continue with the work I've been doing and results we've been seeing within our community.

The community have been loving the workshops, health and fitness classes, kindness initiatives and are excited for all the new programs and workshops that are due to be announced shortly. All of these activities are free to the community! I've received many donations in exchange for advertising (which I've intentionally done as a way to make the money stretch and also promote local business), but eventually the money will run out and so will these programs. Facebook Australia & Singapore offered me a scholarship to participate in community events training and development which I happily accepted and completed. I was offered to sit an exam which Facebook have covered the costs as part of the scholarships so I can receive a Community Manager certificate which is recognised worldwide for the next two years.

I currently have two issues that I'm trying to overcome and I'm hoping this budget will help me, my family and the community.

I work up to 45hrs for our community every week for free! It's been hard work and taken a lot of time away from my own family, but I manage to find a balance for this volunteering role whilst raising my children and making them a priority every day.

However, I don't want all my hard work to go to waste and I don't want to let the community down, but my time on maternity leave is coming to an end and I'm due to return to the workforce very soon, which means I'll need to stop about 90% of the effective volunteering work I'm currently doing. I don't want to come across as arrogant, but I know the work I'm doing is actually making a big difference and having a ripple effect!

I'd love for HCC to consider creating a community liaison officer job and I'd like that person for the job to be me! The role would consist of working with local community centres, assessing their local needs and implementing program, activities, referrals or workshops to address those needs so change can happen.

Let me provide one example. I met with the coordinator of Attwood House last week and she expressed an urgent need with help for the local Samoan community. The Samoan elders have been asking her for over a year for help with their male youths to address anger issues. I immediately started creating a program, reaching out to necessary contacts and have put together an age appropriate, culturally sensitive boxing program that will actually help these young men in our community! We all know you can't force someone to do something if they aren't ready or willing - yet these young men are actually excited about this program and can't wait for it to commence!

Working in child protection and social work roles for over a decade taught me a lot!! One of the things I learnt was that most of the services out there that young people are referred to are out dated and ridiculous! I could also say the same for programs that are designed for women are also outdated. I.e., sewing/knitting classes, book clubs, mums & bubs classes, etc. 95% of young women are not interested

in these kinds of services or programs within the community, but there's a great need and expressed interest for programs that are "new, fresh & fun".

The outdated programs rarely have a positive impact with great results as they don't cater for everyone's needs or preferences. My programs do!! My workshops do!! My initiatives do!! I have people from all walks of life, all ages and backgrounds constantly asking me "what's next" or "what other programs do you have".

In saying all of this - I'm proposing Hume City Council create this job for me to help our community!! If not me – anyone who would successfully fulfil this kind of role and work.

Happier and healthier people means less family violence, better attendance in educational programs and school, less health issues related to anxiety, stress and depression. Less strain on our local medical practices during this global pandemic whilst the government want us to get vaccinated. Less local crimes (vandalism and theft), etc.

Whilst I have my own ABN and can register this as a business myself - I would rather put this opportunity to Hume City Council first considering the [2021-2022](#) budget is being discussed and finalised, so this can be added to your list of community funded initiatives to support locals with OUR tax money. Our community would also benefit from funds to help cover some of these projects, so I'd be grateful if HCC could also consider this as I've managed to make a very little go a long way to help our locals as individuals and as a community.
