

Aitken Boulevard Duplication

Project Information

We're starting construction in April 2022.

The Aitken Boulevard Duplication project will ease traffic congestion by adding more lanes, so you can get where you need to go quicker. We're also adding safety features to lower the risk and severity of crashes.

What's coming up:

Once early works begin in 2022, you will start seeing more workers onsite.

Our contractors will install barriers, temporary signage and set up site offices and storage areas in preparation for major works.

To complete works safely, changes to speed limits and lane closures will be in place. There may be changes to the way you travel around the area including changes to parking and pedestrian detours.

What we are doing:

On Aitken Boulevard, between Central Park Avenue and Grand Boulevard we'll:



add extra lanes in each direction



upgrade existing intersection and traffic lights



install new traffic lights



replace the roundabout with traffic lights



construct new pedestrian crossing facilities



build new shared walking and cycling paths

This project is expected to be complete in early 2023.



What you can expect:

Working hours

Our team will be onsite working between 7am and 6pm, Mondays to Saturdays.

Some works may need to happen at night or outside these hours to minimise traffic disruptions.

We'll work hard to maintain access to homes and businesses at all times. If access needs to be temporarily restricted, we'll notify impacted residents and businesses ahead of time.

Noise and vibration

There will be some noise and vibration during construction. This may be generated from moving vehicles, machinery, rock breaking, reversing beepers or generators used to power equipment.

We'll do our best to minimise our construction impacts and will continue to monitor noise and vibration levels during the works.

Traffic changes

There will be changes to how you move around the area while we are building the new lanes and intersections. We will let you know in advance of any changes.

To complete works safely, we may:

- lower the speed limit
- install temporary traffic barriers and signage
- temporarily close lanes
- provide signed detours for pedestrians and cyclists
- have traffic controllers and portable traffic lights in place to safely guide you through the works zone
- move or temporarily close bus stops. Visit ptv.vic.gov.au to subscribe to Public Transport Victoria for weekly travel alerts.

If you travel through the area, allow extra travel time and consider alternative routes.
